Robby Herbst is an inter-disciplinarian. He is interested in socio-political formations, behavioral architecture, languages of dissent, and counter cultures. Exploration of these fields have lead him to visual art, writing, group work, independent media, public theory and event/exhibition organizing. He has lectured widely on art and politics. His work has been presented in Los Angeles by Machine Project, LACE, and the Museum of Contemporary Art; in New York by Creative Time and P.S.1; in San Francisco by Southern Exposure; in Chicago by Hyde Park Art Center; and at the 2008 California Biennial.
