A public talk by Ant Farm's **Chip Lord**Monday, March 5th, 2012 at 6pm, Betts Auditorium

Chip Lord was trained as an architect and is a media artist who produces both single channel films and video installations. He was a founding partner in the influential seminal radical architecture/media/art/performance/publishing/happenings/graphics collective Ant Farm (1968-1978). "An art agency that promotes ideas that have no commercial potential, but which we think are important vehicles of cultural introspection." Projects included Inflatocookbook, Cadillac Ranch, Media Burn, House of the Century, and Dolphin Embassy. He is Professor Emeritus Film & Digital Media Department at University of California, Santa Cruz.
